

Robert McCullough is Principal of McCullough Research in Portland, OR, and has been in business for thirty two years advising governments, utilities, and First Nations on energy, metals, paper, and chemical issues. He has testified repeatedly in state, federal, and provincial courts as well as before Congress and regulatory bodies. His testimony in front of the Senate Energy Committee is credited with initiating the Enron trading investigations during which he worked for the U.S. Department of Justice and three western attorneys general as well as many civil clients.

He has also worked in market manipulation issues in California (gasoline and electricity), Illinois (electricity), Louisiana (electricity), New York (gold and electricity), and Texas (electricity.)

Before starting McCullough Research, Mr. McCullough was an officer at Portland General Corporation where he had responsibilities in finance, power marketing, and rate setting. He was educated at Reed College, Portland State University, and Cornell University in economics and finance. He is a member of the American Economic Association, the American Financial Association, and the Econometric Association. He has also been an adjunct professor/visiting scholar of economics at Portland State University since 1996.
